This is an Easy Read version of some information. It may not include all of the information but it will tell you about the important parts.



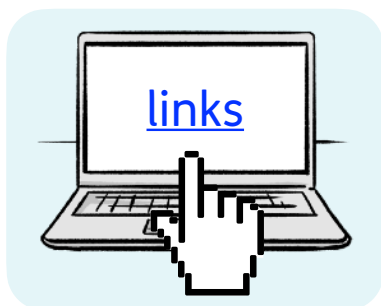
This Easy Read booklet uses easier words and pictures. Some people may still want help to read it.

About The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training



Oliver McGowan was a young man with autism and a learning disability.



Oliver sadly died because the staff that cared for him did not use the skills and information they had to look after him.



In 2022 a new law was made.



This new law says health and social care services must make sure their staff have had **The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training**.

The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training will:



- Teach health and social care staff how to give care and support to people with learning disabilities and autistic people.



- Make sure health and social care staff have the right skills and information.



- Stop what happened to Oliver McGowan from happening again.

The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training has been created by:

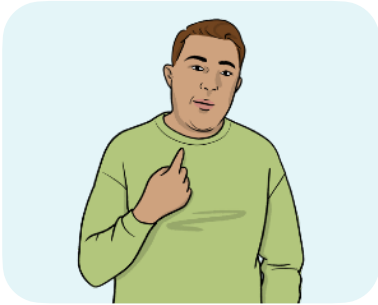


- Health Education England.

- Want to be part of a team.



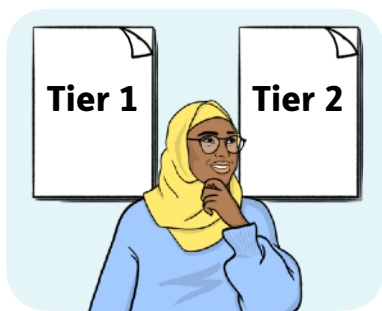
- Can deliver The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training.

Types of training



The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training has 2 types of training - they are called:

- Tier 1 training.
- Tier 2 training.



You can decide to do 1 or both types of training.

Tier 1 training

Tier 1 training will teach health and social care staff about:



- Understanding learning disabilities and autism.



- **Reasonable adjustments** - these are changes that services can make so that everybody can use them.



Tier 1 training will also teach health and social care staff about thinking positively about learning disabilities and autism.

Tier 1 training is:



- 1 hour long.



- Delivered online using a video call.



- Delivered by 3 people - these people are called trainers.

The 3 trainers are made up of:



- 1 expert with lived experience who has a learning disability.



- 1 expert with lived experience who is autistic.



- 1 facilitator trainer - this person helps deliver the training and supports the experts.

If you apply to deliver Tier 1 training, you will need to:



- Make sure you can join online.



- Stay for the whole hour of training.



We will teach you how to deliver Tier 1 training.

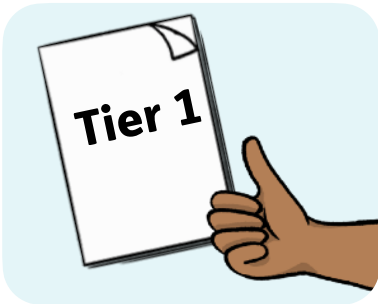


You will be paid £30 for every Tier 1 training session you deliver.



You can decide how many training sessions you want to deliver.

Tier 2 training

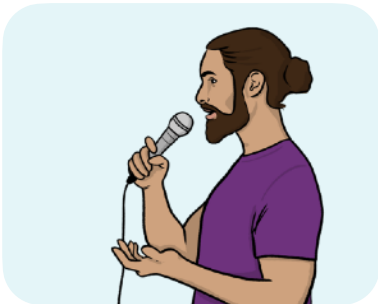


Tier 2 training will teach health and social care staff about the same things as Tier 1 training.

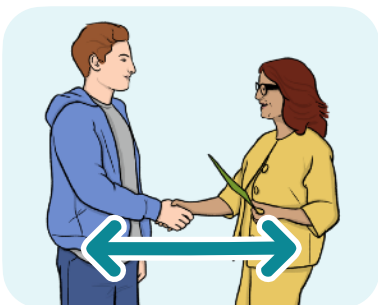
But Tier 2 training will also include:



- A talk from an expert with lived experience who has a learning disability.



- A talk from an expert with lived experience who is autistic.



Tier 2 training is a whole day long and it is delivered in person.

3 trainers also deliver Tier 2 training.

The 3 trainers are made up of:



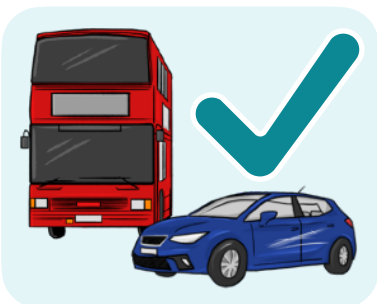
- 1 expert with lived experience who has a learning disability.



- 1 expert with lived experience who is autistic.



- 1 facilitator trainer.



If you apply to deliver Tier 2 training, you will need to make sure you can travel to where the training is taking place.

If you apply to deliver Tier 2 training, you will also need to make sure you can:



- Contribute to the morning session if you have a learning disability.



- Contribute to the afternoon session if you are autistic.



We will teach you how to deliver Tier 2 training.



You will be paid £30 an hour. You will be expected to work 3 hours.



We will also pay you back for some things you have to spend money on whilst you deliver the training, like food and drink.



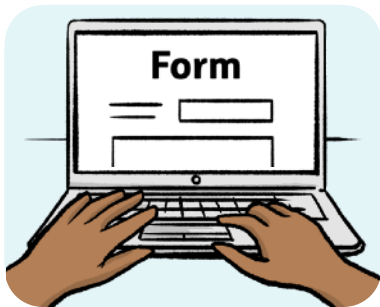
You can decide how many training sessions you want to deliver.

How to apply

Step 1

- Meet other people who deliver The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training.

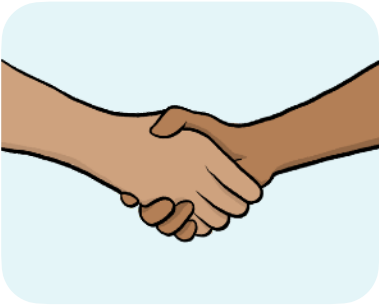


- See how you feel about talking to groups of people.

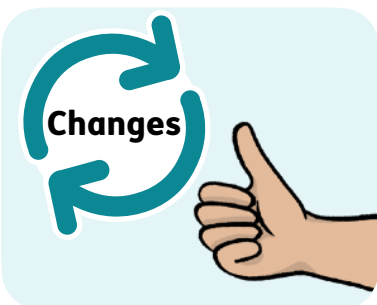

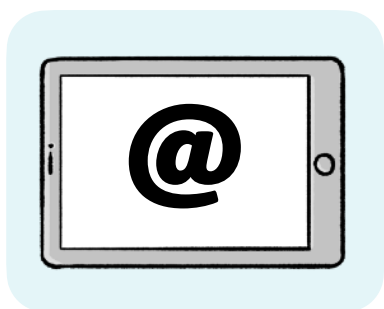
