



Target Audience

Care and Support staff in a variety of settings and Housing Support Teams who are providing direct care and support. This course is also suitable for maintenance teams within Housing and Social Care settings.

This course has been developed to look at COSHH within the workplace and gain an understanding of how this knowledge should be applied within the learners' own workplaces. This course will benefit all staff whose job roles involve them working with substances that can be hazardous to health.

- ◆ COSHH – The eight steps
- ◆ Hazard information and packaging, (CHIP),- Protection by information (symbols and phrases)

- ◆ Explain the importance of good waste management practice in the prevention of the spread of infection
- ◆ Outline own responsibilities, and the responsibilities of others, relating to Health and Safety in a work setting

- ◆ Carry out own responsibilities for Health and Safety
