A Practice Assessor is traditionally known in Health Care as a qualified Nurse who would assess the practice of Nursing students. As Health and Social Care services evolve there is a requirement for competency assessing to take place from within workplaces.

This is important as the task and roles that some staff are responsible for may involve Health Care related tasks, so there is a need to ensure that those tasks are carried out consistently and competently by those staff carrying them out.

This course will support staff to gain the knowledge of how to assess others to ensure that consistency takes place by competent people.

This course is delivered using a range of methods and resources including:

Face to Face tutor facilitation, questionnaires, videos and scenarios for breakout groups, questioning and participation and an end of session assessment.
