Care and Support staff in a variety of settings, and Housing and Housing Support Teams who are providing direct care and support.

This course gives learners knowledge and understanding about Autism as a condition and explores theories and concepts about Autism. Learners will explore how Autism may be experienced very differently from person to person and the importance of understanding each person's unique needs.

This course supports learners to know what good care and support practice that can contribute the positive health and wellbeing outcomes looks like.

- ◆ Face to Face tutor facilitation, questionnaires videos and scenarios for breakout groups, questioning and participation and an end of session assessment.
