A stoma is an opening on the front of the abdomen, made using surgery, which lets faeces or urine be collected outside the body into a pouch. There are several reasons an individual may need a stoma and you may be required to either, support an individual to care for their own or you may need to provide the personal care to ensure the stoma is kept clean and healthy. Together with other professionals, Care and Support workers are able to provide support in a variety of settings to help individuals manage their stoma care. The knowledge gained from this session will provide learners with the knowledge and skills to provide stoma care.
